## **RV CAMPING IN THE NORTHWEST REGION**

Surrounded by beautiful pine flats, this campground has 75 sites, each equipped with water, a picnic table, electricity and fire ring.

In the Florida panhandle, this campground is nestled under tall longleaf pine trees. Each campsite has 20-30-50

amp electric service, water, sewer tap, a picnic table, fire ring and grill. From the campground, the Juniper Lake Trail opens up to the unspoiled beauty of the Blackwater River for hikers.

This 1,962-acre barrier island park has 60 campsites with electricity and water hookups. The campground is located behind historic dunes in the pine forest. Although there are no ocean or gulf views, the campsites are only a quarter mile from the beach and the gulf.

Campers can spend the night on one of the highest hills in Florida. Twenty-four campsites are equipped with water, electricity, picnic tables, ground grills and a clothesline.

This 1,319-acre park has 35 campsites with electric and water hookups available for RV and tent camping.

Multiuse trails near the campgrounds offer six miles of exploration for hikers, bicyclists and horseback riders in the woodlands along the Chipola River.

In the heart of Destin, the park offers a variety of back in and pull-through sites with water, electricity (some 50 amp); picnic tables, ground grills and clothesline posts.

Just south of Tallahassee and near the coast, this campground is nestled in the shady, wooded forest, with electric and water hookups available. Nature trails run along the river and wind through picturesque pine flatwoods.

Fishing is the highlight of this park and the campground overlooks Lake Seminole. Water, electricity, a picnic table and a grill ring are available at each of 30 shaded, semi-private campsites. The campground includes a small boat ramp and a large fishing pier that extends out onto Lake Seminole.

You can experience modern camping along with culture and history. Nestled at Florida's most north-easterly tip, Fort Clinch State Park offers 61 campsites in two campgrounds. Shady, Spanish moss laden oak trees lend to old Florida ambiance in the Amelia River Campground's 40 sites. Just steps from the ocean, the 21 sites at the Atlantic Beach Campground are typical of the Florida beach atmosphere.

**Little Talbot Island State Park M2**

Located in Jacksonville, this campground is nestled among ancient dunes in a lush maritime hammock of live oaks, American holly and southern magnolias. Each of the

Amenities include a campground store, recreation hall, showers and restrooms, laundry, pool and playground.

The carillon's electronic roller plays Foster tunes daily.

Located south of Orlando, this park offers history and recreation. Florida's cowboy heritage comes alive with living history demonstrations of the early Florida cow hunters in an 1870s cow camp, open seasonally. Park amenities include a boat ramp, marina, trails, a playground and an observation tower providing a view of Lake Kissimmee.

Lake Louisa has 60 full-facility campsites nestled between Dixie and Hammond Lake. Each site has 30 and 50 amp hookups. Campground amenities include two bathhouses, two fishing piers, a pavilion and an amphitheatre where ranger programs are held from October to April.

Koreshan State Historic Site offers 60 campsites, all with electricity and water, a picnic table and fire ring. Twelve sites are designated tent camping only and located next to the Estero River. The picnic area is a short walk away.

East of Bradenton, this campground is within walking distance from the swimming and fishing. Water and electricity are available at every site. A boat ramp and launching dock provide access to the lake.

The park also has tours on the world's largest airboats, tram rides through the prairie and a concession with food and a gift shop.

The clean, accessible restrooms have hot showers and laundry facilities. Fifteen miles of trails provide solitude, beauty, challenge and a healthy adventure for everyone.

Located south of Gainesville, the campground is near Lake Wauberg and is heavily shaded. Each site has a lime

rock surface, lantern post, fire ring with grill and picnic table, with nearby water and electric service. Most RV sites have 30 amp electric service, but a few have 50 amp service. Internet access is NOT available in the park.

## **RESERVATIONS AND TIPS**

When the setting sun paints an evening sky, where will you make your bed? Florida's state parks offer a variety of overnight accommodations. At a Florida state park, the day's work is play, a walk on the beach, a hike through the woods, a swim, a bike ride. Tools for the day's work? A fishing rod, a kayak, a book, a friend. What do you want to see when the sun rises on the new day?

Choose a wooded campsite within walking distance of white sandy beaches, or camp along the banks of a quiet moving river. Bring your boat or canoe, or fishing tackle and a rod for a relaxing time with family or friends. Explore nature on many of the hiking trails, while at the same time leaving stress of the busy world behind. Attend a festival, a reenactment or simply do nothing.

## **RV CAMPING**

Florida's state parks offer nearly fifty family campgrounds that accommodate RVs. Each site includes water,

electricity, a grill and picnic table, along with centralized showers, restrooms and dump station. Some campgrounds offer a sewer connection.

## **RESERVATIONS**

Reservations may be made up to 11 months in advance by calling (800) 326-3521, (866) I CAMP FL or TDD (888) 433-0287 or visiting

**FloridaStateParks.ReserveAmerica.com.** Prices per night vary from \$10 to \$60 per night (subject to change). A 50% discounted camping fee applies to Florida residents, 65 and older or 100% disabled.

## **WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW**

- Camping fees vary from park to park and include up to eight people per site, not including children under 6 years old.
- Checkout time is 1:00 p.m. Check-in time is 3:00 p.m.
- Quiet time is from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

- Campsites are limited to two vehicles. Selected campsites may allow only one vehicle.
- Pets are welcome in camping parks. Pets must be kept on a leash no longer than six feet and well behaved at all times. Pet owners are required to pick up after their pets and properly dispose of their waste. Pets may not be left unattended for more than 30 minutes and must be confined in the owner's camping unit during quiet time.
- Service animals are welcome in all public areas of Florida state parks.
- One responsible person, 18 or older, must be present on each campsite.
- All campsites, not already reserved, may be rented by walk-in visitors.
- Campers are limited to a stay of 14 consecutive days or 3 two-week stays during a six-month period.
- On the date of check-out, overnight visitors must leave the site on or before checkout time, but may

remain in the park's day-use areas until closing without additional charge.

Florida's state parks are committed to providing equal access to all facilities and programs. Accessible sites are available. Should you need assistance to enable your participation, please contact the state park directly.
