NELSON GOLDMAN, KEN ROBINSON, CARL WINNER, ROBBIE HAIR, JIM MAULDIN AND JOYCE MILLER Fort Clinch State Park

Originally designed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s, the historic 3-mile drive at Fort Clinch winds through hardwood hammock and ancient dunes. The Historic Canopy Drive Protection Team works to prevent RV incidents and maintain visibility in order to protect bicyclists and pedestrians. The team also is indispensable during storm cleanup.






Long-Term Project of the Year for Nature-Based Recreation




Corporate Contributor of the Year
